Plaintiff's Motion For Written Clarification of Scheduling Order Made April 26,

2022 in Hearing; Alternatively, Leave to File Motion in Limine to Exclude

"Expert" Testimony and Report of Dr. Sanjay Adhia and Supplemental Complaint

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Comes Now, Plaintiff Laura Lynn Hammett who in support of the above titled motion states:

The Court made an order on April 26, 2022 that seemed to restrict the parties from filing any further motions until further notice. Plaintiff is not clear on what the limitations are and when the Court will lift them.

Plaintiff has a pending motion to exclude Dr. Adhia's testimony based on his grossly insufficient initial report.

Defense "expert" Dr. Sanjay Adhia gave Plaintiff an intrusive and disturbing medical exam on May 6, 2022. On May 17, 2022 Plaintiff received the report which was inaccurate, deceitful and distressing. One point is that Dr. Adhia continues to insist that the exam is not confidential, which increases Plaintiff's anxiety. Dr. Adhia elicited disclosure of traumatic events that Plaintiff has shared with no one else, regardless that the details of what caused PTSD are not relevant (according to Plaintiff's therapist).

Dr. Adhia misdiagnosed Plaintiff in contradiction to the robust medical history provided for his review.

Plaintiff turned to the Arkansas Medical Board to see what could be done and found that Dr. Adhia is not licensed in Arkansas and is not allowed to make a diagnosis. He is allowed to only review records of licensed health care providers.

Therefore, Plaintiff hopes to file a motion in limine to exclude any opinion and any "test" results by Dr. Adhia. Additionally, Plaintiff asks that she be able to call Dr. Adhia as a fact witness and call her current therapist who wrote the expert witness rebuttal as an expert.

Plaintiff is also considering filing a second suit against Defendant PRA and joining Dr. Adhia and his practice group. For judicial economy, Plaintiff prefers to file a motion to allow her to supplement the present complaint instead. The causes of action being: Abuse of Process, IIED- Outrage and Invasion of Privacy on Seclusion.

The barebones fact set that Plaintiff hopes to expand upon and brief: Dr. Adhia is a hired gun. He advertises on the internet that he practices nationwide. If allowed to testify in this case, about 17% of his testimony will be in Arkansas. Dr. Adhia has applied and been granted a provisional license to work in another state, so he knows he must follow each state's protocol. He may not be granted a license in Arkansas because of his poor track record in other states and he went to medical school in India, though he claims to be born in Michigan.

Dr. Adhia was grossly inaccurate in his report. He failed to administer the accepted tests for the ailment he diagnosed and for the ailments Plaintiff's providers diagnosed. He contradicted his own opinions stated in his published

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opinions, prior reports and research listed on his CV, (the Cedars-Sinai research was complete before his Texas licensure).

PRA through counsel expressed to one of Plaintiff's medical care providers that it intended to settle, and therefore did not depose the doctor when the doctor showed up pursuant to a subpoena.

Dr. Adhia advertises that his reports have convinced the opposing party to give up. In fact, Plaintiff was so upset after reading Dr. Adhia's report, that she made a settlement offer for half her last offer. PRA did not acknowledge receiving the offer. That was before discovering Dr. Adhia is not allowed to diagnose in Arkansas and the offer was revoked already.

Plaintiff certifies that she contacted counsel for PRA by email numerous times on June 16 and 17 and even 19th, 2022 in hope of meeting and conferring on these issues. In response, there has been radio silence.
